

## Synopsis Brief

Ghost Apples takes place in a small-town centered around a family of four, Jim Conroy, wife Janice Hladki and two school aged children. The family is circling the bankruptcy drain, but Jim is keeping the impending repossessions hidden from Janice.

Jim is hospitalized after cracking open a jar of homemade apple jelly, apple jelly that was made from an apple tree growing in the local cemetery. After Jim's second random encounter with the apple jelly and Janice's quick-witted set of questions, Jim and Janice understand what is happening. Spirits of the dead who have not settled with their corporeal demise are being concentrated in the apple jelly and then released into the person who consumes the jelly. Their possession lasts until the consumer pees. Who knew spirits were removed by the kidneys?

Janice sets up an orientation protocol for new spirit possessions and soon their fridge is half full of started apple jelly jars with name tags on them, name tags that mirror the headstones across the street.

Jim realises quickly that he can harness the vast knowledge and experiences of the local spirits to help solve his financial catastrophe, ...and more, a lot more. Jim's financial problems pale in comparison to the new can of worms that he opens.
